The 670 volunteers supporting Citizens Advice in Oxfordshire contribute over 2650 hours each week and last year helped 20,000 people with 65,500 problems, such as debt, housing, benefit and employment issues.

Volunteers at Citizens Advice help us in roles such as giving our clients information and advice, raising funds, keeping the service running smoothly, and helping with the strategic direction of the organisation.
